Suffix – a group of letters at the end of a word that changes the word's meaning.

Simple sentence – a sentence that makes sense on its own.

Past tense – things that have happened in the past.

Present tense – things are happening now.

Compound sentence – has two main clauses that are joined together by a coordinating conjunction.

Coordinating conjunction – joins two main clauses.

Word class:

Adjective – describes a word, it tells you what it is like.

Verb – is a doing or being word.

Noun - a person, place or thing.

Adverb – describes a verb and usually ends with the suffix 'ly'.

Inverted commas – start and end a line of speech

Expanded noun phrase – a noun that is usually described with two adjectives.

Rules for adding the suffixes 'ful' and 'less':

- Just add the suffix 'ful' or 'less'.
- If there is a 'y' at the end of the word, replace the 'y' with an 'l' and add the suffix.

Apostrophes (a punctuation mark):

- Possession is something that belongs to something or someone.
- Contraction is something becoming smaller. A word or letter is omitted and an apostrophe takes its place.

Formal conjunctions - are used at the beginning of a sentence and followed by a comma. They link sentences together to create cohesion and flow.

Simple sentence – a sentence that makes sense on its own.

• To change an adjective to a comparative adjective, just add -er and to change a adjective to a superlative adjective, just add -est.
